

Year 1– Activities

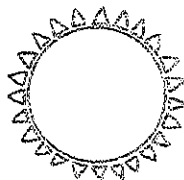
Below are a list of suggestions for you to do with your child during this period.

- Practise counting in 2s, 5s, and 10s. Draw a poster to show your learning.

- Read! Read out loud and discuss your books with your family.


