





Diocesan Policy First Communion/Eucharist

- a) It is diocesan policy for the children to be prepared for First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion in the parish. This preparation should take place in school Year 3 (the year in which the child turns 8 years old). Parents are expected to attend a number of sessions; firstly, so that they can understand the process of preparation that the parish is providing for the children and secondly, to understand their own particular and important role in helping prepare their children for their first and continuing reception of these sacraments. This involvement of the parents in the catechesis, and in witnessing to the place of the sacraments in the life of Catholics is regarded as a critically important element in the parish-based preparation for First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion.
- b) In accordance with the mind of the Universal Church, First Reconciliation precedes First Holy Communion. Holy Communion should be offered under both kinds at Mass. This includes the First Holy Communion Mass, including those children receiving Holy Communion for the first time. The catechesis provided for children should always be adequate ensuring that the children appreciate that Holy Communion has a fuller form as a sign when it is received under both kinds.





Religious Education Curriculum: Come and See

Come and See



A Catholic Primary Religious Education programme written by a group of experienced diocesan advisors.

EXPLORE: Introduction to the topic where the children's life experience is explored, the questions it raises are wondered at, shared, investigated and reflected upon.

REVEAL: Knowledge and understanding of the Catholic faith is revealed through the Word (in Scripture, Tradition, doctrine, prayers, rites and Christian living)

RESPOND: Learning is celebrated and responded to in daily life.

10% of curriculum time not including collective worship / prayer

3 topics on other faiths

Liturgical Events and Celebrations

Collective worship is planned following the structure of the Liturgical year, with reference to the Church's seasons, Holy Days of Obligation (if they fall in term time) and Feast days.

Prayers are taught and said collectively and individually, and the children's knowledge of prayers progresses as they move through the school-


EYFS: The school prayer, lunch time grace, end of school prayer.


Key Stage 1: The school prayer, lunch time grace, end of school prayer, Our Father and Hail Mary



Catholic Schools Inspection



The Catholic Schools Inspection is both a diocesan and a statutory responsibility for Catholic Schools.

In the organisation of the Church, the bishop is the 'first teacher' in the diocese with responsibility for the formation and education of his people, with particular responsibilities in schools. The inspectors working for the Inspectorate act on his behalf to fulfil this responsibility.

The purpose of inspection is to report to and advise the bishop on the quality of the Catholic life and mission of the school, of religious education and of collective worship. Of course, it also stands to inform parents and the wider Catholic community.
